



## Rules

Quick Draw Hold'em is a fun, exciting, and easy to learn variation of Texas Hold'em.

**The object of the game** is for player(s) to receive a winning hand according to a pay schedule, along with optional Bonus Bet Pay Outs.

Quick Draw Hold'em offers two separate **Optional** bonus side bets. The first bonus side bet is the 3 Card Flop Bonus, based on the first 3 community cards, the second bonus side bet is the Best 4 out of 5 Bonus, based on the best 4 out of 5 Community Cards.

Bonus bets must be placed at the **start** of each game. Player(s) win according to Pay Schedules for each of the Bonus side bets. Bonuses will be paid on the highest hand only.

Quick Draw Hold'em offers player(s) an opportunity to play a Texas Hold'em style game without playing against other players or a dealer, and everyone has a chance at winning.

Player(s) who have placed a bonus bet on the Best 4 out of 5 Community Cards are still eligible to receive their bonus even if they elect to fold during the core game.

A single standard deck of playing cards will be used when dealing Quick Draw Hold'em.

**To start the game**, players must place a wager in the circle marked **Flop**. The dealer beginning from their left will deal each player who has made a flop bet two cards. The dealer will then place five (5) community cards in the appropriate spots on the table.

The dealer will reveal the first three community cards (known as the flop). Winning 3 Card Flop Bonus Bets will be paid by the dealer beginning from their right to left, according to the 3 Card Flop Bonus Pay Schedule. Non-winning 3 card bonus bets will be collected by the dealer beginning from their right.

After players view the first three Community Cards, they have an option to either fold or place an additional wager **equal** to the flop wager in the circle marked **Turn**.

Player(s) who fold will lose their flop bet, the dealer beginning from their right will collect non-winning flop bets. The dealer will then reveal the 4<sup>th</sup> community card (Known as the Turn Card).

After players view the Turn Card, they have an option to either fold or place an additional wager **equal** to the Turn wager in the circle marked **River Bonus**. Players who fold will lose their wagers placed on both the Flop bet and Turn bet, the dealer beginning from their right will collect bets.

The dealer will then reveal the 5<sup>th</sup> and final community card (Known as the River Card). The dealer will then proceed to pay or collect Best 4 out of 5 Community Bonus Bets beginning from their right

Player(s) who have made the River Bonus Bet will have their 2 card hand combined with the 5 community cards.

Player(s) who do not achieve a 5 card poker hand containing a minimum of two pair of **7s and 2s or higher** will lose their wagers placed on the Flop Bet, Turn Bet, and River Bonus Bet. The dealer beginning from their right will collect bets.

Player(s) who achieve a winning hand using the best 5 out of 7 cards will be paid on all three of the following betting positions as follows, **Flop Bet even money, Turn Bet even money, River Bonus Bet** will be paid according to the River Bonus Pay Out Schedule beginning from the dealers right.

Four Card Royal	500 to 1
Four Of A Kind	100 to 1
Straight Flush	50 to 1
Three Of A kind	5 to 1
Flushes & Straights	3 to 1
Two Pair	2 to 1
Jack's thru Aces	1 to 1

River Bonus Pay Out Schedule	
Royal Flush	200 to 1
Straight Flush	50 to 1
Four Of A Kind	25 to 1
Full House	5 to 1
Flush	4 to 1
Straight	3 to 1
Three Of A Kind	2 to 1
Two Pair 7s & 2s or higher	1 to 1
